During our kick-off, day-long retreat (facilitated by our Ministerial Transitions Coach, Debby Bergh), we discussed our next steps, deepened our understanding of the entire search process, and chose our primary roles. It was a productive meeting and really helped us get to know one another better and begin on the right foot. We are excited and honored to take on this important work on your behalf.

Over the next few months, we will need lots of help and involvement from the entire congregation, so please look out for communications from us. Key for us is determining who our congregation is, who we want to be, and what kind of minister can help us fulfill those aspirations. There will be two main ways we will gather that information. First, beginning in late August, we will be sending out an online survey to members and friends (or paper for those who don't use email) which will need your careful attention. Then in early October, we'll hold small cottage meetings, which are like focus groups. Look for a letter in your mailbox in late August which will provide a step-by-step explanation of the entire process and your important role in our work.

We've been asked about the confidential nature of the Search Committee's work. We want to make our process as transparent as possible. Down the line, however, aspects of our work with potential ministerial candidates will be confidential. At any point in the process, please do feel free to ask us your questions and we'll provide answers to the best of our ability.

UUSA Safety Policies – Effective Sept 1, 2017

At a meeting in June, the Board of Trustees adopted some important new policies to help provide a safe and enjoyable environment in our building. The policies described below apply to ALL RENTERS AND OTHER USERS OF OUR BUILDING, *including members of the UUSA and their guests*, and are effective September 1, 2017.

June 28, 2017

This letter is to advise of changes in policies regarding use of spaces in the UUSA meetinghouse, to help provide a safe and enjoyable environment in our building.

At least two adults must be present in the same room whenever a child or children are present.

Each renter or other user of UUSA space is responsible for seeing that the person or persons admitted by the user are there to attend the user's program or event. This means, among other things, that:

- 1) The user is responsible for monitoring persons entering to assure they are there to attend the program or event and go only into the areas of the building being used in connection with the user's program or event;
and
- 2) If the user is not able to monitor persons entering the building once the program or event begins, then the user must lock the exterior doors. (Users may share their cell phone number or post the number on the door to facilitate late entry.)

These policies apply to renters and all other users of spaces at our meetinghouse and are effective September 1, 2017.

Our Oak Benches Have you noticed that our four oak benches have been refurbished? Built as a gift for us by **Mark Ledwell**, president of Wright Builders, from one of the pin oak trees on Kellogg Street that had to be removed to make way for our addition, they have graced the exterior of our building for three years now. **Peter Lacey** had re-oiled them once or twice, but they had darkened from moisture and become scratched from snow shovels.

Jerry Gates is a member of First Baptist Church, which houses Craig's Doors, the winter homeless shelter in Amherst and co-sponsor of the UU Wednesday Community Breakfasts. He orchestrated the refinishing. When he offered to do this, I gave him the can of penetrating oil Peter had used, which he in turn gave to **Becky Hobbs**, who he knew from the shelter. Becky sanded each of the four benches and then finished them with the oil. They look bright and beautiful again. The carvings on the benches by architect **Scott Donovan** are now prominent again. Thank you to Jerry and Becky!

As our UU Society prepared to dedicate the benches after they were installed outdoors in October 2014, Mark Ledwell wrote, "My inspiration [in creating the benches] was to honor and preserve something of the great trees that had to come down to build the addition. While one was rotted the other was not and was certainly majestic, an important Urban landscape. I thought it would be a fitting tribute and gift to use wood from the tree to fabricate benches for all.

"Scott Donovan was a UUSA member at the time, since returned, however, to Canada. He offered help with the design, primarily the carved-out designs on the backs of the benches. One is a huge Pin Oak leaf, another is growth rings, the third is of a stylized nut and branch pattern, and the fourth bench back shows a pattern of branches copied from a photo of the actual tree."
